## - Call for Community Representatives

Do you have an interest in social, environmental and economic matters in the Upper South East?

Hybrid Energy Australia is currently seeking interested members of the local community to participate in the FuturGas Community Consultation Group (CCG).

The FuturGas CCG will be an independent forum that will provide advice and guidance to Hybrid Energy Australia in planning for the company's proposed FuturGas Project.

Nominations are being sought for four (4) Community Representatives with differing interests and also a desire to represent the viewpoints of the wider local community.

The aim of the FuturGas CCG is to:

- Allow for the exchange of information and advice between the company and the community;
- Provide a mechanism for gathering local knowledge and input into project planning studies and process; and
- Assist the company to identify local issues and discuss appropriate strategies relating to the project.

The company has appointed QED Pty Ltd as the independent facilitator of the FuturGas CCG. QED is a South Australian based consulting firm specialising in a range of project areas including planning and the environment.

It is planned for the FuturGas CCG to be in place for an initial period of twelve to eighteen months.

The FuturGas CCG will meet in the evenings at Kingston on a quarterly basis, with the first meeting anticipated to be held in October 2008.



Based on the development of a lignite (coal) resource near Kingston, the FuturGas Project involves a coal-to-liquids gasification plant with integrated electricity generation, incorporating leading-edge carbon dioxide capture and storage capabilities.
